**The Pledge of Allegiance was at 6:30 p.m.**

**PUBLIC HEARING – REVIEW PROPOSED LOCAL LAW #1 – 2008 UNSAFE  
BUILDINGS.**

**The first Public Hearing began after the Pledge of Allegiance. The Public Hearing is in regards to the proposed Unsafe Building Law #1 – 2008. Mayor Stewart stated that if you have any comments, please stand and state your name. He stated that we will go around the room in an orderly fashion. Everyone will get a chance to speak.**

**Howard Maneely had a question about landlord responsibility when transferring a title. He stated that as part of this law, it doesn't mean that a landlord can just sign the building over to out from under the title and their responsibility of the building right? Village Attorney Race stated that that is correct; it is drafted as such that just because you transfer the title does not mean that because of what you did in the past, it does not alleviate the landlord of responsibility. Howard Maneely thanked the board for all its work on this.**

**A gentleman in the audience spoke in regards to this law. He stated that he does reposition of houses. If there is some kind of code violation whether it is lawn care needed, broken windows, garbage in the yard, etc we ask that if you post the violations on the door, when we come to inspect these houses for the banks, we will make sure that these are rectified sooner for the Village. The banks respond very rapidly when there are violations; we inspect every 2-4 weeks. Please just post the violations and we will make sure that things get taken care of. No one else in the audience had any comments.**

**Mayor Stewart stated that we will keep the hearing open for a little while longer just in case someone else comes in and would like to comment on this proposed law.**

**Attorney Race stated that the one change that we will be making is Section 1K; it will be deleted.**

**Mary Armstrong came in and stated that she feels it is necessary to take down these old buildings and is very happy that the board is working on it.**

**Mayor Stewart stated that he received one letter which is from Earl LaVoie. He was unable to be here tonight. He states in the letter that he is positive and in favor of both laws. This public hearing closed at 6:44 p.m. with no further comment from the public.**

**PUBLIC HEARING – REVIEW PROPOSED LOCAL LAW #2 – 2008 VEHICLES ABANDONED.**

Scott Smith, a Village Business Owner stated that he would like to thank the board for their work on this law and for the changes being made. He stated that he did not agree with the enclosures; in the proposed law, section 2, it refers to a 6 foot high fence constructed so that people cannot see into it. I feel we are defeating the purpose if we want to get rid of the junk, we shouldn't be hiding it. He said that he felt it would hide the problem of these abandoned cars throughout the Village. He stated that at his place of business, Smith Towing, he has a fence. Not enclosed but there is a fence. If we require a fence that is closed in, and we have a break in during the night, I feel that a police officer responding to a break in with an enclosed fence is in danger of not knowing what or who is in there and can bring harm to them. With the open fence, at least they can see inside the fence and know what they may be dealing with. Mr. Smith stated that he installed a high tech security system for the purpose of bringing assistance in during a break in; the police officer will go in blind if he cannot see who he may be dealing with behind the fence. The other issue that he has with it is Section 10 where it says commercial garages. There is a 30-day limit with that. He would like to see that moved to a 90-day period.

Attorney Race stated that this part of the law as far as fencing only applies to storage of cars by commercial garages and/or wrecker garages, not to private residences. Residents would have to have these cars stored in a building, not allowed to just put up a fence. He also stated that we would consider making the 90-day change.

Mr. Smith stated that he also would like to see the removal and storage of towed vehicles stay within the Village limits or at least within the Township of Malone. We should keep this local.

The Mayor went around the rest of the room and asked if anyone else had comments; no one had anything to add. Mayor Stewart announced that he will keep the public hearing open for another 3 minutes just in case anyone would like to speak.

Attorney Race stated that he had one administrative change; on Page 2 the definition of Code Enforcement Officer will be just code enforcement officer; all of the other officers will be taken out, because the Village does not have them.

Trustee Richards asked the Attorney if he had any comments on the 90 day change. He said it seems reasonable but we will look at it further. There is already an extension on this of 90 days. My concern would be if we give 90 days then it's extended for another 90 days we are actually looking at 120 days. The attorney spoke with Scott Smith about it and stated he would get a hold of him after he looked into things further to make sure we are all in agreement. Scott Smith stated that he had one more question about the definition of commercial garages. And he asked if anyone is being grandfathered in in this law? The attorney said no, no grandfathering in. Mayor Stewart closed this public hearing at 7:03 p.m.

**NEW BUSINESS.**

Mayor Stewart stated that operating costs are up significantly at the WWTP and this includes fuel and electric costs. We currently have 6 individual haulers that dump there and we charge them \$.05 per gallon. We haven't had an increase in some time. Dolly Maguire and I went over some figures. Increasing the cost of dumping to \$.06 per gallon would certainly help a little with the increase in our costs.

Upon motion made by Trustee Patnode, seconded by Trustee LePine and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board accepts and approves the increase in dumping fees for individual waste haulers from \$.05 per gallon to \$.06 per gallon effective February 1, 2008.

Upon motion made by Trustee Hafter, seconded by Trustee Richards and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board approves and authorizes Mayor Stewart to sign final payment estimate for Contract #2 – General Construction for the water system improvements, in the amount of \$8297.00.

- 4. VILLAGE OF MALONE FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE PERIOD  
ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2007.**

Dolly Maguire stated that she wanted to mention in regards to the interest income that there has been a significant decrease in interest rates. Interest rates dropped below 4% and 3 1/2% is now being offered. The treasurer spoke more on revenues and then explained about some expenditures that we were faced with lately; snow equipment repair and fuel costs to name a couple. Also, on future financial reports, you will no longer see Medco. They will be reporting to you directly. The treasurer asked if anyone had any questions about the report and there were none.

Upon motion made by Trustee Richards, seconded by Trustee LePine and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board approves and accepts this financial report as presented.

**5. MORTGAGE DISCHARGE – SHANE LAMICA.**

Upon motion made by Trustee Patnode, seconded by Trustee LePine and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board approves and authorizes Mayor Brent S. Stewart to sign such mortgage discharge as presented; it has been reviewed and approved by Village Attorney Nathan Race.

**6. COMMITTEE REPORTS.**

Mayor Stewart stated that the DPW have been taking down our streetlights; they are trying to refurbish what they can. They are in tough shape. Been there for 17 years now and are pretty weather checked. They are doing some welding where they need to be welded and repainting them. We have not been able to come up with the monies for total replacement yet but we are looking to see what we can come up with. What they have done and put back up look nice. Trustee Richards stated that maybe at budget time we can start up a reserve for the replacement of these lamps. Nothing is offered by the state at this time.

Also, a few members of the Zoning Board, Planning Board and Village Board met for a work session to discuss ideas and changes that need to be made in our code book and for some areas of the Village.

Jeff Smith, DPW Supervisor, gave an update on the water meters. He stated that the first week of March we should be able to get started on this. We ordered the first round of meters. Letters will go out informing people about the process. We will be doing site visits also. Trustee Patnode asked how many plumbers are available in the Village to install these. Jeff thought maybe 4-5 in Malone, however, you may see some plumbers from Massena or Plattsburgh being called. He is also recommending that these plumbers be insured.

**8. NYCOM – ANNOUNCEMENT IN REGARDS TO FUNDING.**

**Dolly Maguire stated that as you know the state released its executive budget recently and I wanted to let the board know how it would affect us. They are proposing that there be an increase in AIM funding by 5% and that would mean an increase of \$4136.00 for us. However, unfortunately, the CHIPS funding looks like it will decrease from \$85000.00 to \$81365.00. So if you balance the two out, it would mean an increase to us by \$501.00.**

**9. PROCLAMATION – WEAR RED FOR WOMEN DAY- FEBRUARY 1, 2008. (ALICE HYDE MEDICAL CENTER/ COMMUNITY WELLNESS SPECIALIST, JOSY DELANEY.)**

**PROCLAMATION**

Whereas, National Wear Red Day celebrates the extraordinary progress in women's heart health and recognizes that more needs to be done in Malone, New York to safeguard women's health for generations to come.

Whereas, Heart disease is the #1 killer of women and one in four American women dies of heart disease.

Whereas, Most women do not know that heart disease is a women's problem and they do not take it seriously.

Whereas, The risk factors for heart disease are smoking, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, overweight/obesity, physical inactivity, diabetes, a family history of early heart disease, and age.

Whereas, Women can promote their own heart health and prevent disease and illness by taking steps to prevent and control the heart disease risk factors.

Whereas, Keeping women healthy and promoting awareness of women's health issues, including heart health, is an important responsibility and depends on the actions of many organizations and groups in our community.

Whereas, Women's health remains a priority for families, communities, and government, and our commitment to keeping women healthy is stronger than ever.

Whereas, *The Heart Truth* campaign and its Red Dress symbol are building awareness of women's heart disease risk and empowering them to reduce their risk and prevent heart disease.

**10. APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE RFP FOR A PLANNING AND ZONING ENGINEER TO ASSIST IN REZONING AND ASSIST IN THE PREPARATION OF CHANGES IN THE CURRENT WORDING IN THE VILLAGE OF MALONE CODE BOOK; ZONING AND SUBDIVISION.**

**Mayor Stewart stated that we could really use some assistance on this; we need the services of someone who specializes in this area, so we can start this process. We need some guidance. Members of the Zoning Board, Planning Board and Village Board met once already in a work session and all were in agreement that we need a firm to help us get this rolling.**

**Upon motion made by Trustee Richards, seconded by Trustee LePine and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board approves and authorizes the Request for Proposals for the purpose of the rezoning and preparation of changes in the current wording in the**

Village of Malone code book; zoning and subdivision. A legal notice will be placed in the Malone Telegram, Press Republican, and Watertown Daily Times.

**11. KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS REQUESTING A 30-DAY WAIVER FOR LATE SUBMITTAL OF LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION.**

Upon motion made by Trustee LePine, seconded by Trustee Richards, and unanimously carried by the Malone Village Board, the Knights of Columbus were granted a 30-day waiver for a liquor license application.

**12. MALONE VILLAGE POLICE DEPT. YEARLY REPORT – 2007.**

This report was read by Mayor Stewart, and reviewed by the Malone Village Board and will be on file at the Village Clerk's Office. Chief Stone could not be at the meeting tonight; something came up at the last minute.

**OLD BUSINESS.**

**1. APPROVAL NEEDED FROM THE BOARD; WORKPLACE VIOLENCE PREVENTION POLICY AND INCIDENT REPORTING.**

Village Clerk, Tammy LaValley explained that several months back the Board approved a door chime, personal panic buttons, etc. to better protect and alert employees at the Village Office when the public enters. Those were physical changes that were made, however, by law we are supposed to post a written policy in the offices for the Village. This policy states that this new law protects employees from feeling threatened by other employees and/or the public. This policy is a generic policy that the clerk inserted the Village of Malone name and will post this policy in plain view of the public and employees. It will also be distributed to the other Malone Village departments; DPW, Justice Court, etc. Tammy is the contact person if someone should have a problem with feeling threatened. She will appoint a second contact person just in case she is not available. The Clerk asked that the board approve such written policy.

Upon motion made by Trustee Hafter, seconded by Trustee Patnode and unanimously carried, the Workplace Violence Prevention Police and Incident Reporting is approved as received.

**2. MR. HAROLD SWINWOOD/HOUSING IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM PROJECT AGREEMENT.**

Mayor Stewart stated that Mr. Swinwood he had an agreement with HUD through the Village for a loan on his home. It would be the board's decision on how we go with this. Attorney Race stated that the Board members are familiar with this. The board has to decide if they want to go ahead with legal action; this means foreclosure on his house. He is on default with the loan on his home because he moved out way before the loan was to be paid.

Upon motion made by Trustee Richards, seconded by Trustee LePine and unanimously carried, the Village Board approved to go forward with legal action against Mr. Swinwood. This would mean our attorney giving him notice as to the board's decision, and if doesn't pay the money back, then we would proceed with foreclosure proceedings. Trustee Richards stated that he does have another residence so he isn't being put out on the streets.

**3. LOCAL WATERFRONT REVITALIZATION PROGRAM – RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT; TO SUBMIT TO DEPT OF STATE.**

Upon motion made by Trustee Hafter, seconded by Trustee Patnode and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board approves this resolution of support for the LWRP funding as presented in said resolution:

RESOLUTION # 1-2008

WHEREAS, New York State, is making available funding for the Local Waterfront Revitalization through the Environmental Protection Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Town and Village of Malone are in the process of developing a LWRP entitled "Salmon Greenway: River of Opportunity, that was funded from a previous EPF grant; and

WHEREAS, in order to continue and complete the mission of developing policies to revitalize the waterfront and surrounding area, with the goal of enhancing the economic, cultural and recreational opportunities in Northern New York State, additional time and funding is required; and

WHEREAS, the tasks to be completed include the development of local implementation techniques, the drafting of an environmental impact statement, and the completion of a preliminary draft LWRP; and

WHEREAS, the Town and Village of Malone have determined the total cost to complete this project to be \$40,000, with matching funds offered, primarily through in-kind- services, by the Town and Village in the amount of \$20,000;

WHEREAS, the Village and Town of Malone are eligible applicants under the in New York State Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, and are therefore eligible for financial assistance; and

NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Village of Malone does hereby support and approve the application through the Village of Malone for funding in the amount of \$20,000.00 from the Environmental Protection Fund for the continuation and completion of the LWRP entitled :Salmon River Greenway: River of Opportunity.

5. WILLIAM L. MCCABE.

Mr. William L. McCabe was given the opportunity to speak by Mayor Stewart. However, Mr. McCabe did not speak; he approached the bench (podium) where the Mayor, Village Board, Clerk, and Attorney were sitting and placed an envelope that was sealed with a letter inside in front of the Village Clerk.

Upon motion made by Trustee Patnode, seconded by Trustee Richards and unanimously carried by the Village Board, the Village Board of Trustees went into executive session for the purpose of a particular employee issue.

EXECUTIVE SESSION. (IF WARRANTED)

Upon motion made by Trustee LePine, seconded by Trustee Hafter and unanimously carried by the Malone Village Board, the Village Board of Trustees came out of executive session.

Upon motion made by Trustee Richards, seconded by Trustee Patnode and unanimously carried, the Malone Village Board went back into regular session.
